Peace Drums Update

Peace Drums is a unique, interfaith initiative promoting peace among Jewish, Muslim, and Christian Youth. It introduces peacemaking and reconciliation through the shared activity of a dynamic steel drum band. Under the guidance of Harvey Price, Westminster Presbyterian Church and Congregation Beth Shalom founded Peace Drums in 2013. The organization brings middle school youth from Haifa (Jewish) and Ibillin (Palestinian), Israel to learn to play steel drums (Caribbean music!). Through playing music together the children forge lifelong ties and understanding of their different faiths and culture with the goal of peace within the community. Christmas Boxes Project is Wrapping Up!


Every year, Westminster fills more than 120 boxes at Christmas with food and gifts for families in need in our community. Be a part of this joyful project!
