## PREPARATION FOR WORSHIP

*On All Saints' Sunday the church celebrates the witness of the people of God who have gone before us in faith. Originally, it was an occasion for the church to commemorate those martyred for their witness to Christ. It eventually came to include glad remembrance of all God's faithful people who have died. In the New Testament, the word saint is used to refer to any follower of Christ. The Greek word for saint literally means "one being made holy." Thus, a follower of God is one who is being transformed. Today, we celebrate All Saints' Day by giving thanks for those loved ones who nurtured us in the Christian faith and now live eternally with God.*

### **Surprised by Hope: Rethinking Heaven, the Resurrection, and the Mission of the Church**

DVD class and group discussion  
Today through December 19, in the Daughtry House Classroom (next to WPC parking lot)  
(no class on November 14 or 28)

Based on the book by N. T. Wright, this six session video series looks at a major question we face as humans: "What happens after I die?" Author N. T. Wright outlines the present confusion about a Christian's future hope and shows how it is deeply intertwined with how we live today. Wright, contemporary Biblical scholar, asserts that Christianity's most distinctive idea is bodily resurrection. He convincingly argues that what we believe about life after death directly affects what we believe about life before death. If God intends to renew the whole creation – and if this has already begun in Jesus's resurrection – the church cannot stop at "saving souls" but must anticipate the eventual renewal by working for God's kingdom in the wider world, bringing healing and hope in the present life. Lively and accessible, this series will surprise and excite all who are interested in the meaning of life, not only after death but before it.
